Funding Updates-

- Okanogan County Electric Co-op (OCEC) is in the process of entering a contract with BOCC using AARPA funding for the \$500,00 in match. This is for the WSBO grant to serve the upper Methow Okanogan Valley. We are hoping the PUD will approve this project for it is not included in their budget.
- James Lightfoot (ACRS)- BAT is in a holding pattern for the Community Connect grant.
- PUD Reconnect 4 is moving forward PUD is filling out their application.
- Looking for public comments for BEAD funding.
- As our BAT moves forward, does it make sense to serve those minimal residents who have a
 high cost per passing? One thing to consider is the life expectancy of fiber verses wireless is that
 fiber has a life expectancy of 20-30 years, which can be upgraded over time, while wireless
 network is 8 or so years.
- WSBO grants and funding opportunities are now tied in with digital equity and educational services. As our BAT moves forward it is important to discuss ways, we can service the community in order to receive funding.

Digital Equity Update-

- April Wertz (Methow Net)- Joanna Bastian is working on getting the word out for Digital Equity
 in Methow area. Spreading the word on resources for social services; including newspaper
 articles and speaking with locals.
- Roni Holder-Diefenbach (Economic Alliance)- Attending the first North Central Washington Coalition meeting who meet quarterly and is about broadband infrastructure. Included in the

NCW coalition are Douglas, Chelan, Okanogan and Grant counties. It is all of our broadband action teams coming together to discuss the work that we're doing in broadband, but also in digital equity.
